



CONDITIONS FOR TOURIST RUNS HOCKENHEIMRING IN BADEN-WUERTEMBERG

1. Setting foot on and driving anywhere on the Hockenheimring facilities is done at the participant's own risk. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH is only liable for intent and gross negligence of its supervisory personnel.
2. Driving on the Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg is only permitted with a valid driver licence. Persons trespassing on and driving on the race track without permission will be prosecuted.
3. The Road Traffic Act (StVO) applies on the Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg. Motor vehicles prohibited in accordance with the Road Traffic Act must not be operated on the Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg. Vehicles with a "red licence plate number" are only allowed if permitted by the Road Traffic Act (StVO). Hockenheim-Ring GmbH reserves the right, due to the noise they cause exceeding the limit of 90 dB, to also exclude from the tourist run vehicles that are permitted in accordance with the Road Traffic Act (StVO).
4. Drifting on the race track as well as on all surfaces of the Hockenheimring is prohibited.
5. Entering and exiting the grounds of the Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg is only allowed at the paddock entry (Continental Bridge entrance). Vehicles on trailers are prohibited from entering the grounds.
6. The instructions of supervisory personnel must be followed. The supervisory personnel exercise the property rights and are entitled to expel any violators from the grounds.
7. Participants must drive only in a clockwise direction around the race track. In doing so, they must drive in the right lane and overtake in the left lane. Stopping, turning around and/or reversing is not allowed on the race track. Motorcyclists must wear full protective clothing and seat belts must be worn, including on the rear seats of vehicles.
8. Vehicles that are no longer operational must be towed away in the direction of driving. Participants themselves have to take responsibility for this.
9. The tourist runs must not be used for testing, training and races.
10. Barriers must be observed and must not be removed without authorisation.
11. The schedule for the tourist runs can be viewed on the website at www.hockenheimring.de. The Hockenheim-Ring GmbH reserves the right to make changes to dates and opening times, for example as a result of weather, events, performance of work, etc.
12. Any damage to the facilities of the Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg caused by participants themselves must be immediately reported to the supervisory personnel.
The perpetrator is liable for damages. For all damage involving other vehicles, the damage claim must be asserted against the perpetrator.
13. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH has no influence on claim settlements and is hereby excluded from any responsibility from the outset.
14. The Hockenheimring in Baden-Wuerttemberg actively promotes environmental protection in all its corporate divisions. That is why all the environmental regulations must be complied with. Moreover, unnecessary noise pollution, such as letting engines run on, is to be avoided. Used oil and other waste must only be poured only into the containers provided. Used oil and special waste shall be disposed at the expense of the polluter.
15. Any commercial activity on the Hockenheimring facilities requires a permit from Hockenheim-Ring GmbH and may result in legal consequences in case of violation.
16. With the purchase of an entry ticket for the tourist runs, Hockenheim-Ring GmbH is granted the irrevocable permission to take images and use them for its purposes.
17. The statutory provisions shall apply for all matters not specifically mentioned in the context of these conditions.
