

CONDITIONS FOR TOURIST RIDES AT THE HOCKENHEIMRING BADEN-WÜRTTEMBERG

1. Entering and driving on the entire grounds of the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg is at your own risk. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH accepts no liability for personal injury, damage to property or financial loss, or for any consequential damage resulting therefrom. This also applies to the culpability of vicarious agents. This limitation shall not apply in cases of liability for wilful intent, gross negligence or injury to life, limb or health.
2. Driving on the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg is only permitted with a valid driving licence. Unauthorised access to and use of the racetrack will be prosecuted.
3. The German "Straßenverkehrsordnung" (StVO) apply at the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg. Vehicles not authorised in accordance with the German "Straßenverkehrsordnung" may not be driven on the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg. Vehicles with "red licence plates" are only permitted if they are approved in accordance with the German "Straßenverkehrsordnung" (StVO). Hockenheim-Ring GmbH reserves the right to exclude from tourist drives also vehicles that are authorised in accordance with the German "Straßenverkehrsordnung" (StVO) owing to excessive noise levels of max. 98 dB (A.). You cannot claim for compensation or repayment of the driving fee in the event of a driving ban imposed for this reason.
4. Access to and exit from the grounds of the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg is only permitted at the entrance to the paddock (Continental-Brücke). When you enter the grounds for the first time, you will receive an access wristband that will allow you access to the grounds for the entire duration of the event. If you have to leave the grounds during the event, you can only re-enter with this wristband.
5. You must follow the instructions of the supervisory staff. The supervisory staff exercise the access rights and are authorised to expel offending persons from the grounds. You must observe the barriers, which must not be removed without authorisation.
6. Driving on the racetrack is only permitted in a clockwise direction. The rule is: drive on the right, overtake on the left. Stopping, turning and/or reversing is not permitted on the racetrack. Motorcyclists must wear full protective clothing and seatbelts are compulsory in vehicles, even in the back. Drifting on the racetrack and on all areas of the Hockenheimring is prohibited. The tourist rides may not be used for testing, training or racing. Vehicles that are no longer operational must be towed away in the direction of travel. Participants are responsible for this themselves.
7. You can find the dates for the tourist rides on the website **www.hockenheimring.de**. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH reserves the right to change the dates and opening times, e.g. owing to weather conditions, events, work being carried out, etc. or owing to circumstances attributable to force majeure (e.g. mobilisation, war, riot) or similar circumstances (e.g. strike, lockout). You cannot make claims for compensation on this basis.
8. You must report self-inflicted damage to the racing track, verges, fencing, crash barriers or other facilities of the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg immediately to the supervisory staff. The party responsible is liable for damages. In the event of any damage involving other vehicles, the claim for damages must be asserted against the party responsible.
9. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH accepts no responsibility for the settlement of claims between participants or between participants and third parties. In the event of damage caused by Hockenheim-Ring GmbH or its vicarious agents, claims will be settled in accordance with the statutory provisions.
10. The Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg actively protects the environment in all areas of the company. As a result, all environmental regulations must be complied with. In addition, unnecessary noise, such as running engines, should be avoided. Used oil and other waste may only be poured into the containers provided. The disposal of used oil and hazardous waste is at the expense of the party responsible.
11. Any commercial activity in the area of the Hockenheimring Baden-Württemberg facilities requires authorisation from Hockenheim-Ring GmbH and may result in legal consequences in the event of non-compliance.
12. By purchasing the admission ticket for the tourist rides, you grant Hockenheim-Ring GmbH irrevocable authorisation to take photographs and use them for its own purposes.

13. For safety reasons, it is prohibited for drivers of motorbikes to use cameras attached to the body (in particular helmet, clothing or equipment) or to the vehicle (e.g. GoPro, action cam etc.) while driving. Participants who violate this regulation during the ride may be excluded from further participation by Hockenheim-Ring GmbH.
14. Only the German terms and conditions are binding, the English translation is for information purposes only.
15. Photographic Documentation of Tourist Rides

- (1) The tourist rides may be accompanied by photographic documentation by an external, self-employed photographer. Only the drives on the racetrack will be photographed. At the time these terms and conditions come into force, this is:

- (2) The photographs taken may depict vehicles, visible license plates, as well as occupants of the vehicles.
- (3) The creation, storage, publication, and marketing of the photographs are carried out independently by the Photographer. The Photographer operates their own online shop through which participants can purchase the images. Hockenheim-Ring GmbH is not the operator of this online shop.
- (4) The processing of image data is carried out on the basis of Art. 6(1)(f) GDPR (legitimate interest). The legitimate interest lies in the documentary coverage of the event as well as in offering souvenir photos to participants. The taking and publication of photographs is carried out within the customary framework of comparable motorsport events.
- (5) Participants have the right to object to the processing pursuant to Art. 21 GDPR on grounds relating to their particular situation. In the event of a justified objection, the relevant image will not be published or will be removed without delay.
